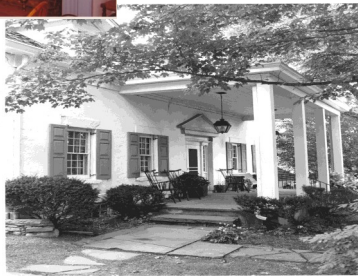

Martin Berry House

We invite committed neighbors, supporters, history enthusiasts and others to participate in this exciting project.

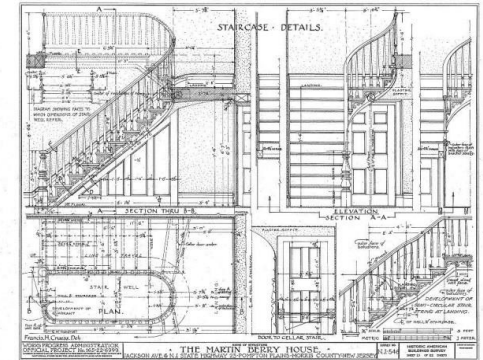


A BIT OF HISTORY

The Martin Berry House has always played a key role in the history of both Morris County and the Township of Pequannock.

Professional architects have determined the home was built circa 1720 and remained in the Berry family for four generations. In 1862 the property passed out of the Berry family and was later purchased by Capt. James R. Evans, a decorated Civil War veteran.

In the late 1930s the Federal government began to recognize our nation's architectural heritage and authorized a comprehensive documentation of the home as part of the Historic American Building Survey.



In 1972 and 1973 the home was listed on the State and National Historic Registers and is the only Pre-Revolutionary War home substantially unaltered in the Township. Also during the 1970s, the Town Council recognized the historical significance of the property and rezoned it from commercial to residential.
